Harry Holzer is a Professor and Associate Dean of Public Policy at Georgetown University and a Visiting Fellow at the Urban Institute in Washington DC. He is a former Chief Economist for the U.S. Department of Labor. Professor Holzer's research has focused primarily on the labor market problems of low-wage workers and other disadvantaged groups. His books include *The Black Youth Employment Crisis*; *What Employers Want: Job Prospects for Less-Educated Workers*; *Employers and Welfare Recipients: The Effects of Welfare Reform in the Workplace*; *Moving Up or Moving On: Who Advances in the Low-Wage Labor Market*; and *Reconnecting Disadvantaged Young Men: Improving Schooling and Employment Outcomes*.

Robert Doar is the Commissioner of the New York State Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance where he is responsible for the administration of the state's cash assistance, food stamps, child support, homeless housing and disability determination programs. From 1995 to 2000, Mr. Doar was New York's child support director and the Deputy Commissioner for the Division of Child Support Enforcement at OTDA.

Tani Mills is Chief Program Officer of the Center for Employment Opportunities (CEO), a large New York City-based nonprofit corporation that provides employment services to men and women returning from prison and other individuals under community justice supervision. In this capacity, she is responsible for all facets of participant training, counseling, workforce development and job placement services, as well as program and staff development, overseeing a staff of more than 30. In addition, she directs the planning and implementation of CEO's Responsible Fatherhood Program and several other major initiatives. Ms. Mill holds a Master's Degree in Forensic Psychology from John Jay College of Criminal Justice.
