**Prison Reform and Reentry in Maryland
March 24, 2006**

Thomasina (Tomi) Hiers is the Executive Assistant to the Deputy Secretary for Operations at the Maryland Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services. In this capacity, Ms. Hiers has been appointed to develop a comprehensive system for offenders re-entry for individuals incarcerated in the adult state prison system.

Before joining the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services, Ms. Hiers served as the Director of the Maryland Re-Entry Partnership (REP) Initiative at the Enterprise Foundation. REP is a collaborative effort between the state and local law enforcement, non-profit and community-based organizations that provided a seamless, comprehensive system to assist offenders in their transition from prison to community through a network of services.

Prior to joining the Enterprise Foundation, Ms. Hiers served as Assistant Director of the Baltimore City HotSpots Initiative/Comprehensive Communities Program (HS/CCP) for the Mayor's Office on Criminal Justice (MOCJ). HS/CCP is a comprehensive community-based crime prevention program that focuses on building community capacity, community policing, proactive community supervision, community maintenance/nuisance abatement, and positive alternatives for youth and at-risk adults.

Ms. Hiers has a B.A. in Economics-Sociology/Anthropology from St. Mary's College of Maryland and an M.A. in Sociology from Morgan State University.
