

## John Jay Research IMPACT: Key Metrics, 2018-19

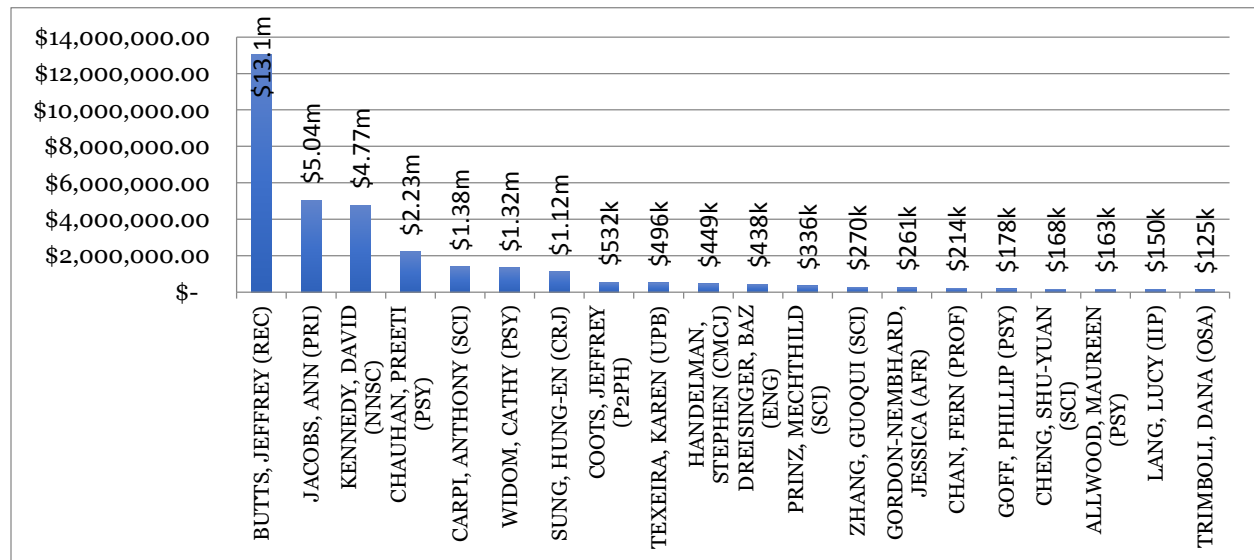
### 1. External Funding Profile

Diverse funding sources keep JJC 3<sup>rd</sup> in CUNY FY 2019 external funding, with almost \$34 million total.

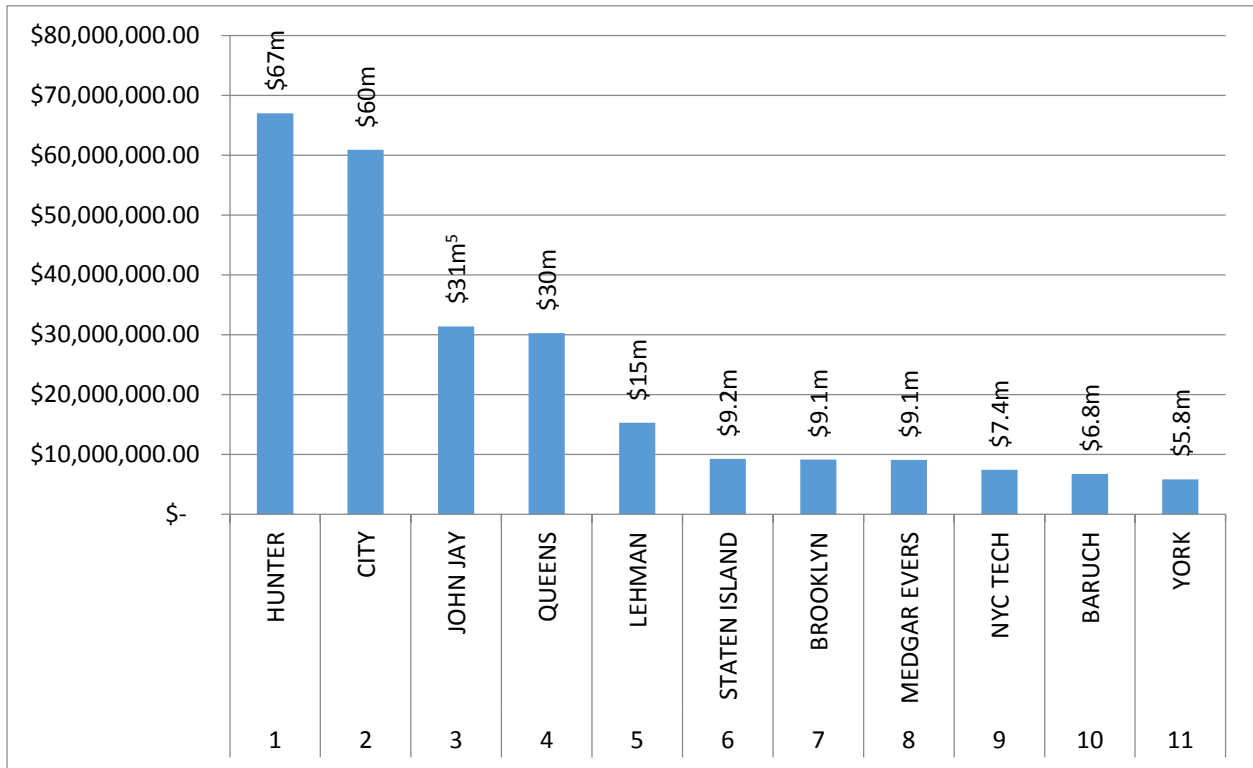

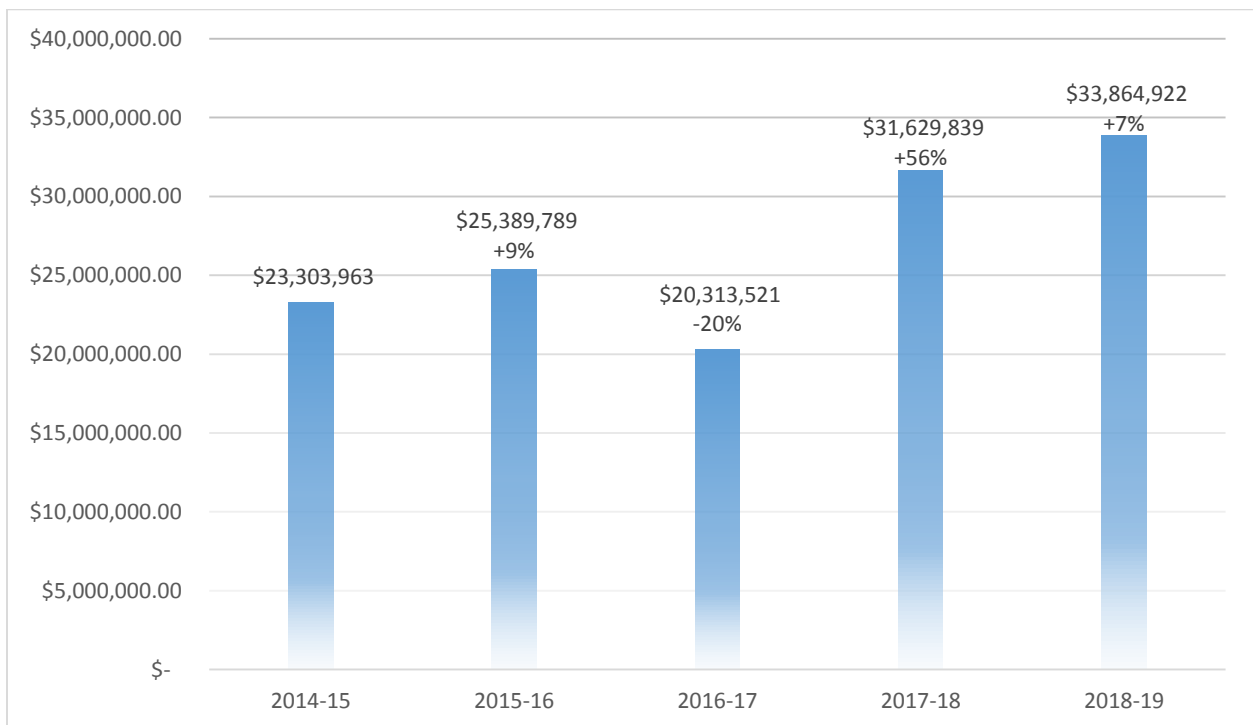

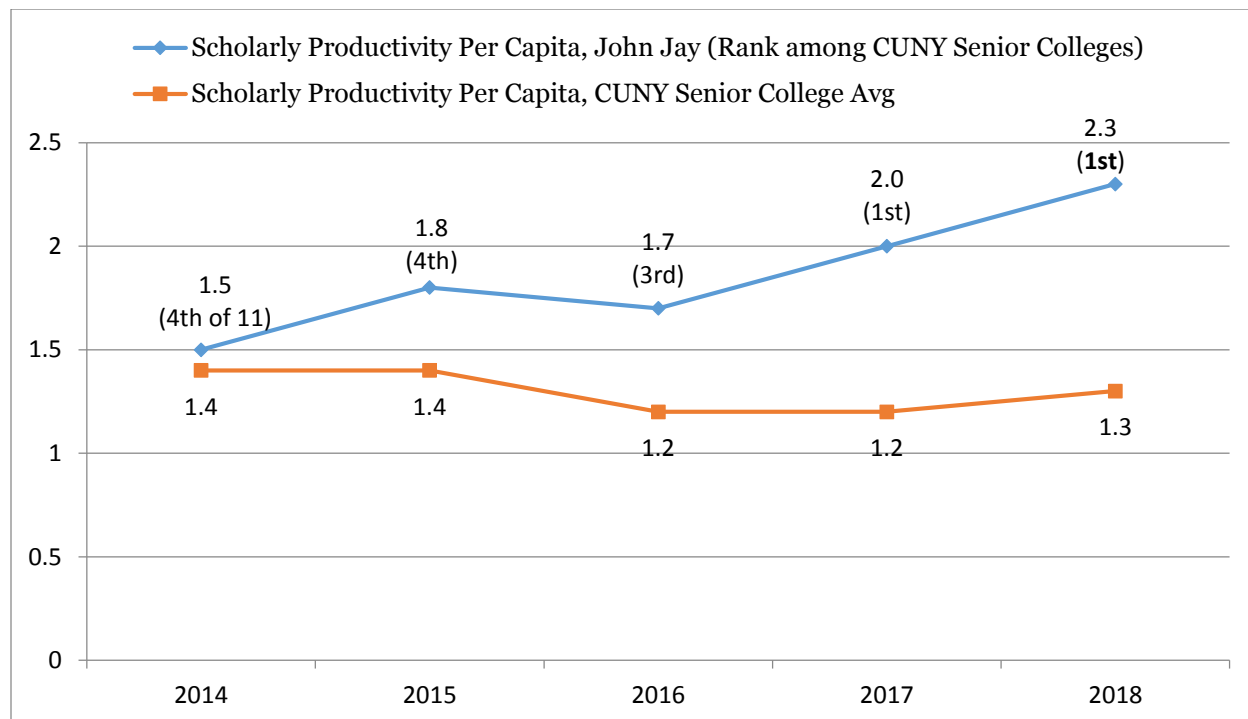
## 2. Scholarly Productivity

A focus on peer reviewed publications and other high-impact scholarship kept John Jay in 1<sup>st</sup> place among 11 CUNY senior colleges in scholarly productivity.

OAR continues to steadily increase the reinvestment of indirect recoveries from external grants in a range of targeted internal funding programs.

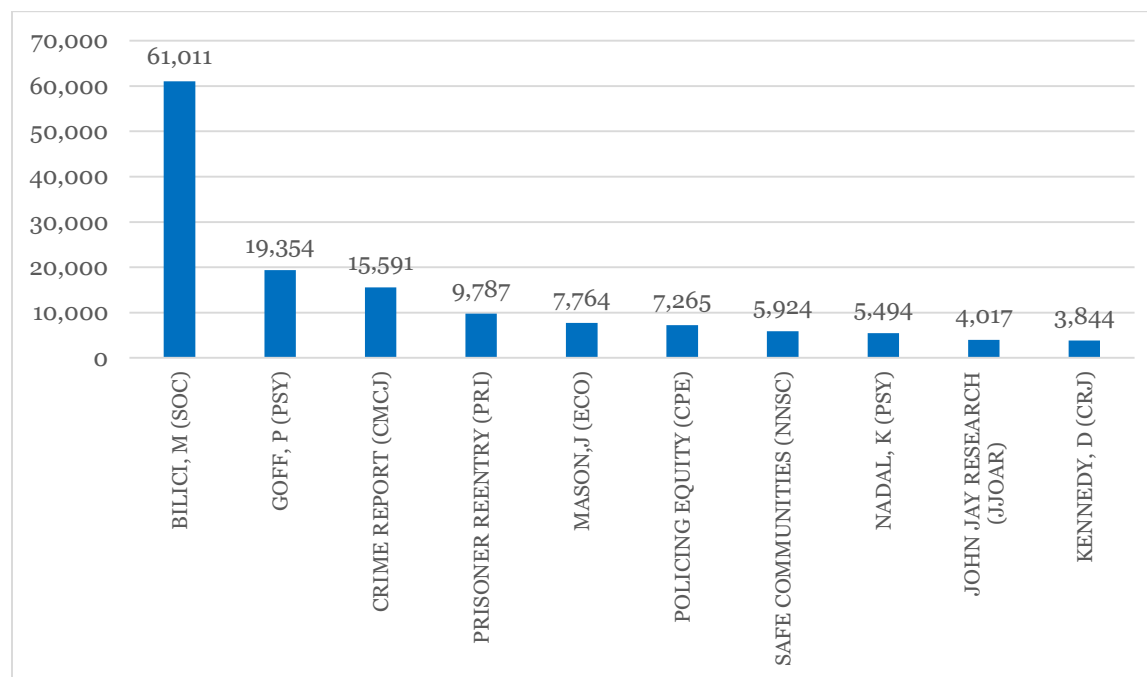
