F. Articulation Agreement Follow-up Procedures

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their Chairpersons and/or program directors.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

Each semester JJC will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of enrolled BMCC students.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisors, websites, etc.:

This articulation agreement will be publicized on BMCC's website, and JJC's website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
