



A.A. Liberal Arts → B.A. Global History

Borough of Manhattan Community College (BMCC) graduates who complete the Associate of Arts degree in Liberal Arts will receive 60 credits toward the Bachelor of Arts degree in Global History at John Jay College of Criminal Justice as indicated below.

Major Part 3 guidelines:

- Students will complete a total of six elective courses (18 credits).
- At least two courses from each category: U.S. History, Non-U.S. History, Premodern History.
- A maximum of two 100-level courses.
- At least two courses at 300-level.

This plan assumes that students are transferring to John Jay College with 60 credits. Students are required to earn 120 total credits in order to graduate with the BS degree.
