I know that this isn't how anyone envisioned their journey at John Jay, but even within this virtual world, know that our commitment to student success, professional growth, and community support is stronger than ever.

In an effort to keep our community safe and healthy, while also continuing to offer our students an excellent education, 99.5 percent of the instruction at John Jay College for the Fall 2020 semester will be conducted in a distance-learning format, as outlined in our detailed [Reopening Plan](#). Our goal is to have the lowest density of people possible on campus throughout the semester. When we abruptly transitioned to a distance-learning model this past March, there wasn't much time to sharpen our online skills. But in record time, our faculty and staff shifted thousands of students to a virtual platform and adapted lessons to an online model. In spite of all the challenges, our community kept our students on track, and graduated the largest class in the College's history. Now, we're ready to build upon the skills we learned this past spring.

This summer, there have been some key leadership changes at John Jay that I'm happy to share with you.
