Institution Graduation Rates are calculated as the percentage earning the degree pursued or a higher degree at the college of entry any time prior to the start of the subsequent fall term(s). Students who earned a degree lower than that pursued, but who are still enrolled for the degree pursued in the subsequent fall term(s), are counted as still enrolled and are not counted as having earned the lower degree.

Institution Persistence Rates are the sum of the retention and graduation rates.

Note: Zeros in the graduation rates indicate that a number of students, less than 0.05 percent, graduated. So the rate rounds down to 0 percent, whereas a blank indicate that zero students graduated.
