The Office of Institutional Research is pleased to present the John Jay College of Criminal Justice Fact Book.

ABOUT THE DATA:

General:

*The source for all of the data in this publication is the CUNY Institutional Research Database (IRDB) of the Office of Applied Research, Evaluation and Data Analytics (OAREDA), Office of the Vice Chancellor for Budget, Finance, and Information Services, The City University of New York. The IRDB reports census data and is the official college data used for all federal, state and accreditation reporting.

*All data reflects the John Jay College “home” student population in their journey towards earning their credentials. “Home” institution students are those students whose primary college of enrollment is John Jay (i.e., excludes permit-ins).

*All tables reflect an unduplicated student headcount with the exception of the credentials conferred tables 16, 17, 23 and 24.

*Students with double majors are only counted once under their primary major of enrollment with the exception of the credentials conferred tables 16, 17, 23 and 24.

Admissions:

*Due to testing disruptions caused by the pandemic, SAT scores were not required for new freshmen admission to CUNY institutions beginning in fall of 2020. As of fall 2023, CUNY adopted a test-optional policy which has resulted in few score submissions by applicants, and those submitted tend to be higher than prior years because applicants generally only submit SAT scores if they strengthen their application. As a result, this metric is no longer reported.

*As of fall 2019, the University Application Processing Center (UAPC) discontinued the use of the “conditional admit” admission type and therefore it is no longer reported.

Academic and Personal Characteristics:

*Fall 2021 and prior, gender data was collected by CUNY at the binary level only. Beginning Fall 2022, nine gender identity categories were offered to applicants as follows: A Gender not listed, Another, Female, Gender Nonconforming, Indeterminant/Intersex, Male, Non-binary, Not Specified and Transgender. All reporting reflects the gender identity self-selected by students on their application for admission.

*Race/ethnicity reporting reflects the race/ethnicity category self-selected by students on their application for admission.

Program and Outcomes Data:

*Bachelor’s/Master’s dual degree program reporting is at the class level of the student at the time of the term/year specified in the table. Class level designations are determined by the total cumulative credits earned by a student and not indicative of the completion of one of the component degrees.

*Program-level graduation rate data for all Bachelor’s/Master’s dual degree programs will not appear under those tables as first-time freshmen students cannot declare a dual degree program upon entry to the institution.

*Program-level graduation rate data for all Master’s/Master’s and Master’s/Professional dual degree programs are reported under the master’s degrees graduation by program table (Table 21) as graduate students apply to a specific program for admission.

SECTION V. GLOSSARY

DEFINITION OF TERMS:

***Credentials conferred:** reflects a duplicated headcount metric, within and across academic years specified. It represents a numerical count of credentials awarded within the term/year specified without regard to student admit type or term/year of first enrollment (i.e., not a cohort- or time-based metric). Students earning more than one credential (i.e., double major, dual degree, stacked credentials) are reported under each credential and term/year of conferral.

***Credential-seeking:** any enrolled student with declared enrollment in a John Jay College Bachelor's, Master's, certificate, advanced certificate and/or accelerated dual degree program authorized for administration by the New York State Education Department (NYSED).

***Degree-seeking:** any enrolled student with declared enrollment in a John Jay College Bachelor's, Master's or accelerated dual degree program authorized for administration by the New York State Education Department (NYSED).

***First-time Freshmen:** a student that has no prior college or university enrollment anywhere.

***Full-Time Equivalent (FTE):** the standard academic measuring unit used to calculate enrollment. For the fall and spring terms the FTE for each student per term is based on the number of credits of the courses the student is enrolled in (in that term) divided by the number of credits defined as full-time status (i.e., 15 for undergraduates and 12 for masters students).

***Full-time Student:** Undergraduate students enrolled full-time must carry a minimum of twelve semester credits or the equivalent.

***Home Student:** those students whose primary college of enrollment is John Jay (i.e., excludes permit-ins).

***Internal Transfer:** students that have changed majors/programs or switched from non-degree-seeking to credential-seeking status within John Jay College. These students are considered "continuing" students and are not included in any transfer student metric.

***Master's Graduation Rate:** a cohort-based metric. Graduation rates represent the percentage of new, fall term entry, master's degree-seeking students who attain their degrees within the years specified (typically four years) as measured from their first fall term of enrollment. This data metric is cumulative, inclusive of all students that graduated within the time frame specified.

***Master's Retention Rate:** a cohort-based metric. Retention rates represent the percentage of new master's degree-seeking students who return to the institution to continue their studies the following fall term after their first fall term of enrollment.

***New Transfer:** refers to students that transferred in to John Jay College from another college or university, including other CUNY institutions.

***Regular Admit:** a student status defined as an admitted student not enrolled in ESL or SEEK programs.

***Undergraduate Retention Rate:** a cohort-based metric. Retention rates represent the percentage of full-time, first-time, fall entry, bachelor degree-seeking students who are enrolled again the very next fall after their first fall term enrollment.

***Undergraduate Graduation Rate:** a cohort-based metric. Graduation rates represent the percentage of full-time, first-time, fall entry, bachelor degree-seeking students who attain their degrees within the years specified (typically four and/or six) as measured from their first fall term of enrollment. This data metric is cumulative, inclusive of all students that graduated within the time frame specified.

***Unduplicated Headcount:** students are counted only once within a term/year as specified for a column or row of data.
