

What Are We Doing About Learning Loss?

Math faculty teaching first-year courses and staff of the Math & Science Resources Center are tackling the problem of learning loss head on. Too many NYC high school students are not meeting grade-level proficiency in math. Many of these students come to John Jay without the preparation to succeed in their first-year math courses.

The faculty and MSRC are working together to expand tutoring and workshops, including a new program partnering faculty with specific tutors. Thanks to these efforts, more than double the number of students have attending tutoring and workshops compared to last fall.





College Planning - Be Heard This Year


