The office focuses primarily on student success, student learning, curricula, and academic standards, and requires working directly with faculty, Department Chairs, Graduate Directors, and staff.

The department houses two majors and a minor, with roughly 1,200 students in all. During my term, the department employed a full-time administrator, 28 full-time faculty, and around 30 adjuncts. As chair, I was responsible for all the administrative tasks of the department. These included course scheduling, managing the department's other-than-personnel budget (roughly \$30,000 per year), managing all aspects of the personnel process, and developing and implementing our strategic plans. The following are my major accomplishments as chair and in other departmental leadership roles:

- Major revision of the Political Science and Law & Society majors
- Mentoring of junior and mid-career faculty, including four successful tenure and promotion cases and one promotion to full professor; except for my promotion, this was the first since 2006
- Creating and executing the department's first outcomes assessment plan

- Engaging the department in John Jay's version of the Writing Enhanced Curriculum project
- Growing experiential learning opportunities in the curriculum
- Developing and supporting departmental racial justice initiatives
- Advocating for and hiring seven full-time faculty in my term as Chair
