
Panelist: Will Creeley



Will Creeley is the Legal Director of the Foundation for Individual Rights and Expression (FIRE), a nonpartisan nonprofit dedicated to defending expressive rights nationwide, both on and off campus. Since joining FIRE in 2006, Will has spoken to countless students, faculty members, administrators, attorneys, and members of the public about the importance of freedom of expression.

Will oversees FIRE's litigation, campus rights, legislative and policy, and public advocacy departments, and his commentary has been published and featured in a wide variety of publications and outlets.
