WHAT IS SEEK?

SEEK (Search for Education, Elevation & Knowledge) is a New York State program at CUNY's senior and comprehensive colleges designed to assist students who are both academically and financially disadvantaged.

SEEK, which in 2011 was renamed The Percy Ellis Sutton SEEK Program, is a four year program established by the New York State Legislature for the senior colleges of the City University of New York to provide access to higher education for promising high school graduates who are not fully prepared but have demonstrated the potential to pursue undergraduate degrees at John Jay College of Criminal Justice.



SEEK ELIGIBILITY

In order to apply for the SEEK Program you must be BOTH academically AND financially eligible and meet the following criteria:

- Be a legal resident of New York State for at least one year prior to entering college;
- Be a high school graduate or recipient of a state-approved equivalency diploma;
- Be inadmissible according to the admissions criteria established for the CUNY four-year college you want to attend;
- Be a first-time freshman or previously enrolled in College Discovery (CD) Program, an Educational Opportunity Program (EOP), or Higher Education Opportunity Program (HEOP); and have a gross family income that meets the New York State guidelines.
