What courses do you need to take to fulfill the requirements of the Bachelor of Arts International Criminal Justice (ICJ BA) major?

In order to graduate with a BA degree in International Criminal Justice you must take **three pre-requisite courses** (9 credits) and **13 core and elective courses** (39 credits). Taking the ICJ 381 Internship in International Criminal Justice course (3 credits) is highly recommended, but is *not* a requirement.

Use this table to determine what courses you need to take. Where a course is already listed in the “Your Choices” column, there are no choices and you have to take this course.
