1. Students may substitute a semester-long internship in a gender-related field or an approved Independent Study with a GS faculty (GEN 389) for one elective. In addition to the regularly offered electives listed above, a number of unique electives that count toward the major will be offered each semester. The Director of the Gender Studies Program will compile a list each semester and disperse it amongst Gender Studies majors and minors.

2. PSY 333 Psychology of Gender is equivalent to BMCC's PSY 245 Psychology of Women.

3. SOC 215 Social Control and Gender is Equivalent to BMCC's SOC 210 Gender and Society.

4. GWS 300 Capstone in Gender and Women's Studies at BMCC fulfills Gender Studies Electives Category B at John Jay. If a capstone projects fits more appropriately in Category A, students may consult with the John Jay major coordinator about moving the course to that category.

5. If students complete PSY 245 Psychology of Women at BMCC in addition to the three required transferrable courses (GWS 100, SOC 210, and GWS 300), they will need to complete two courses from Category A in Gender Studies electives at John Jay College for a total of 2 courses (6 credits) in Gender Studies Electives.

G. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their chairpersons and/or program directors.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

Each year JJC will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:


This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website, and the JJC website.

Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.




