E. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their chairpersons/program directors.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

On request, John Jay will provide the sending institution with the following information: a) the number of students from the sending institution who applied to the program; b) the number of students from the sending institution who were accepted into the program; c) the number of students from the sending institution who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, websites, etc.:

This articulation agreement will be publicized on the websites of both the sending and receiving institutions. Transfer advisers at the sending institution will promote this agreement with eligible students.
