



ADVANCED CERTIFICATE IN CRIME PREVENTION & ANALYSIS

This advanced certificate program, offered by the Master of Arts in Criminal Justice program at John Jay College, provides advanced instruction in techniques for deterring crime. The program also offers instruction in quantitative, computer-based skills needed to analyze crime patterns to develop strategies that can be employed in reducing crime.

Students may obtain the advanced certificate without pursuing a master's degree. The certificate is appropriate for students whose career objectives include crime pattern analysis in public or private sector agencies.

- Requires 15 credits to complete
- Offered each Fall and Spring semester
- New York State Education Department certificate awarded upon completion
