



ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

BETWEEN: John Jay College and Queens College

ESTABLISHING: An accelerated transfer agreement for John Jay College English Majors planning to enter the Queens College Post-Baccalaureate Initial Certification Advanced Certificate (English)

1. Students at JJC will choose the English major, and ensure that they complete each of the following:
 - LIT 260 Introduction to Literary Study
 - LIT 300 Text and Context
 - Three literature courses
2. Students must have a GPA of 3.0 or better and have accumulated 60 or more credits of undergraduate course work in order to be admitted to the program. They are expected to maintain a GPA of 3.0 or better throughout the BA.
3. During the Junior and/or Senior year of study at John Jay, while continuing course work toward their BA degree, students may take (by epermit) up to four Queens College graduate-level Education courses. These courses will count as elective credit for the John Jay BA and they will also be accepted for transfer credit (up to 12 credits) when the student is admitted to the Queens College Post-bac Initial Certification Advanced Certificate program.
 - SEYS 536 Educational Foundations
 - SEYS 700 Language Literacy and Culture
 - SEYS 560 Seminar in the Teaching Middle and High School
 - ECPSE 550 Foundations of Special Education
4. After graduating from John Jay, students enroll at QC and begin their clinical year, taking the following courses:
 - SEYS 580 Standards Based Curriculum & Assessment in Teaching
 - SEYS 552 Educational Psychology (fall only)
 - SEYS 570.2 Initial Clinical Experience (fall only)
 - SEYS 570.4 Student Teaching
5. After completing remaining course work for the post-baccalaureate Initial Certificate program and fulfilling the state requirements for initial certification, students can apply for admission to Master's programs leading to professional certification: e.g., the Secondary Education and Youth Services Department's MS Ed English program, MAT in English Education, or other relevant Master's programs in the Education Division, or the English MA.
